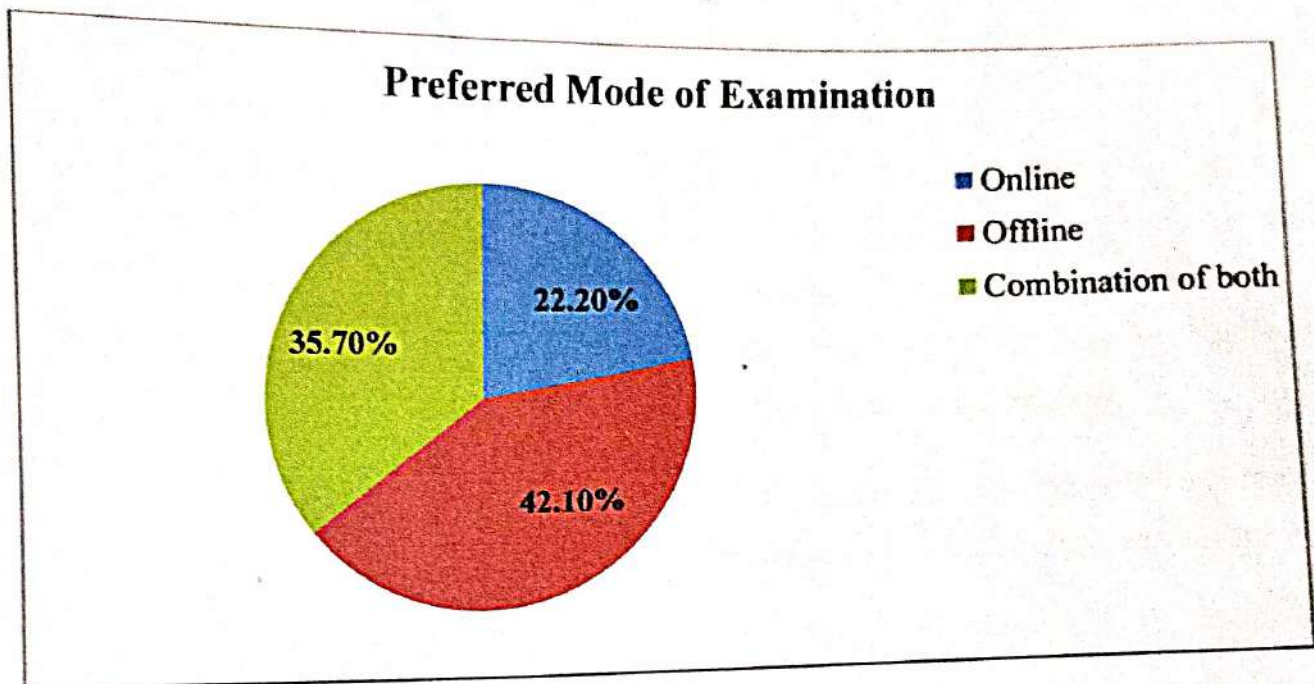


It is observed that almost 49 % students preferred offline mode of teaching-learning. On the other hand around 37 % of total number of respondents opined that combination of both online as well as offline methods should be used for teaching learning.



We observe that, 42.1 % of the total respondents were of the opinion that examinations should be conducted in an offline mode where as 35.7 % respondents felt that there should be combination of offline as well as online examinations and 22.2 % preferred an online pattern of examination.

The Pooled Satisfaction Index of students on questions 1 to 14 listed above for Teaching – Learning & Evaluation for Hislop College is found to be **3.34** on a 4-point scale based on the 3756 responses of students.

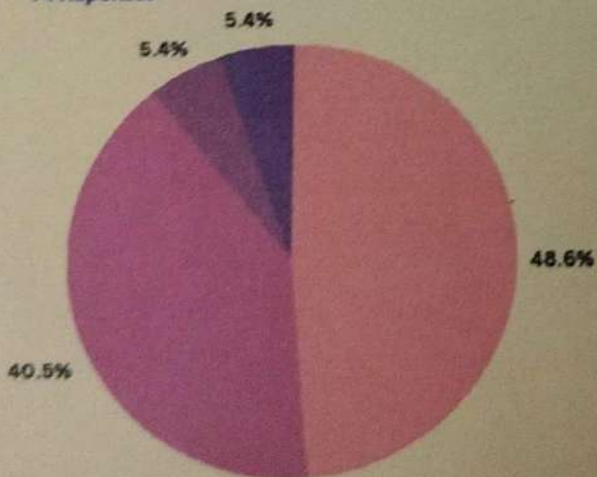

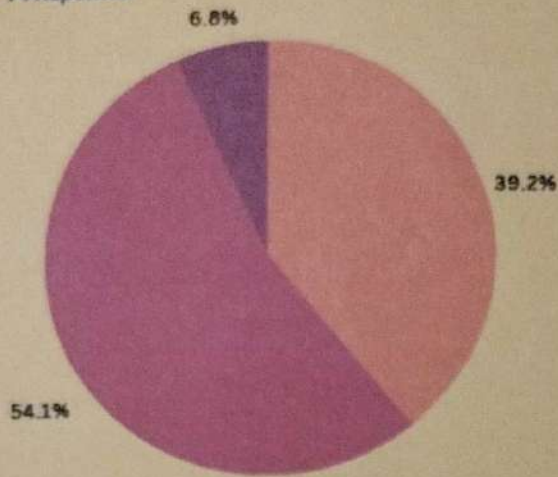

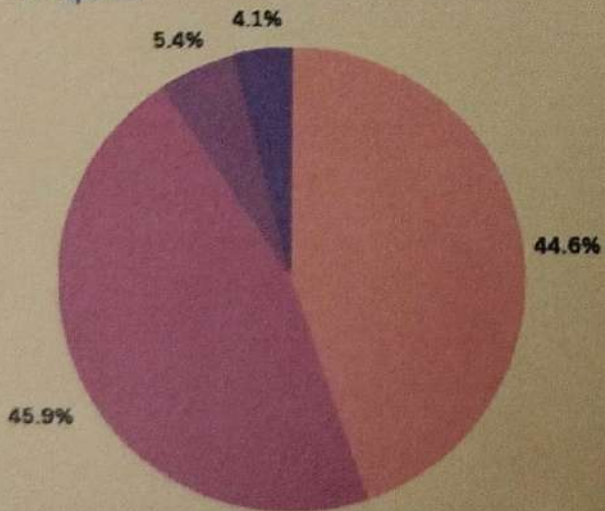

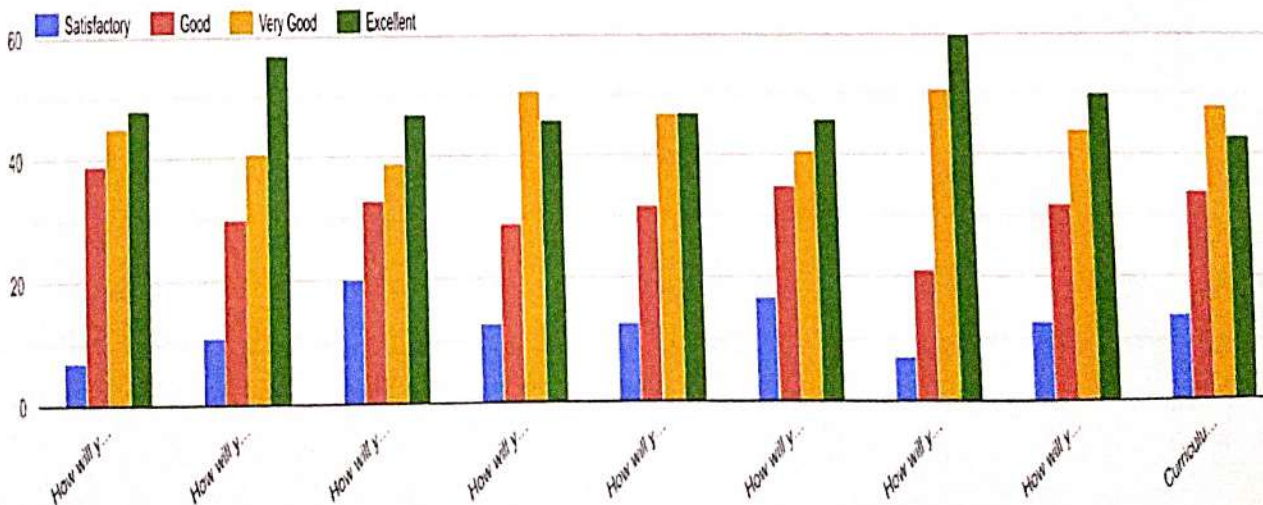
FEED BACK ANALYSIS 2021-22

Action Taken Report on Feedback Reports from Teachers (2021-22)

As Hislop College is an affiliated college, it doesn't have a direct role in the review and revision of the existing programme structures and academic syllabi. The college however plays an indirect role as many of its staff members are members of Board of Studies. The Board of Studies is a statutory body which handles the academic affairs such as introduction of a new Academic Programme, revision of syllabus, review of academic rules and evaluation methods etc. Each academic department of the University has a Board of Studies.

The analysis of the feedback obtained from the Students, Teachers and the Alumni was communicated to the Members of the Board of Studies of various departments of the college so that it can be effectively used as a guiding resource for the designing of the syllabus.



Feedback from Students on Teaching- Learning Evaluation	It was observed that there was an overall satisfaction among students with the teaching-learning process in the college with the average pooled Student Satisfaction Index on Teaching Learning Evaluation of 3.34 on a 4 point scale	The departments were conveyed their individual scores and were encouraged to continue adopting more student friendly teaching techniques based on ICT.
Feedback from Students on online mode of TLE	<p>The most preferred method of online mode of teaching for the students is Power Point Presentations followed by teachers teaching live with pen or using whiteboard on laptops.</p> <p>It was observed that the least preferred method of online mode of teaching for the students is teachers delivering audio lectures on phone.</p>	Teachers were asked to make add variety to their lesson using technology to their advantage. They were advised to use whiteboards, pointers, engaging power point presentations, drawing tools, virtual games etc to have the students more involved in the lesson. Teachers were also exhorted to upgrade their technical skills.
Feedback from the Alumni of the college	<p>The alumni have approved of the efforts being taken by the teaching staff in supporting students to stay abreast of the latest developments in their respective fields.</p> <p>The alumni have also validated the efforts of the college staff in supporting the overall development of the students, even in online mode.</p> <p>The HOPE Sponsorship has acted as an incentive for students to aim for better grades.</p> <p>The Summer and Winter Internships provided by the alumni have made the students industry-ready.</p>	<p>The Alumni Association would widen the membership and raise more funds for the students.</p> <p>The Alumni Association would leverage the reach of the alumni of the college to create more employment opportunities for students.</p>

Minutes of the Meeting on Feedback from Stakeholders held on July 7, 2022 at 12:30 p.m. in the Conference Room of Hislop College, Nagpur

- 1) A meeting was called to order by the Principal of Hislop College, Dr. Prashant Shelke on 7/7/2022 at 12:30 p.m. in the Conference Room of the college.

- 2) The following members were present in the meeting:

- 3) The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) Analyses was presented by Dr. Jyoti Shiwalkar, Convener of the Student Mentoring Cell; the analysis of the feedback of the alumni was presented by Dr. Mousumi Bhowal, the convener of the Hislop Alumni Association; the analysis of the feedback of the teachers was presented by the IQAC co-ordinator, Dr. Pratik Michael.

- 4) It was resolved to address the issues raised by the stakeholders (as given under) in the feedback analysis.

- 5) As far as the scores of the SSS on the teaching-learning process are concerned, the decision was taken to convey the individual scores of the SSS to the heads of each department.

- 6) It was unanimously decided that teachers need to be encouraged to upgrade their ICT skills to meet the current demands of the teaching-learning process.

7) With reference to the feedback analysis of the Alumni, it was observed that the alumni showed satisfaction with the teaching-learning process of the college. It was also resolved that the Alumni Association (AA) needs to raise more funds so that more marginalized students could be included in the mainstream through the HOPE scholarship.

8) The convener of the AA was asked to leverage the reach of the alumni and create more internship opportunities for students of the college.

9) In connection with the scores of the teachers' feedback on the syllabus, it was observed that teachers showed the least satisfaction with regard to the relevance of the contents of the course to the current needs of the market and society. The teachers also felt that the curriculum was not updated to equip students with the skills required in the market. As the syllabus for the formal programs is prescribed by the University, it was decided that the points raised in the analysis be conveyed to the teachers of the college who are members of the Board of Studies of various subjects and also the teachers who play an important role in the revision of syllabus of the University.

10) The need for more Add-on courses and skill developments workshops for the students was also discussed.

11) Dr. Prashant Shelke thanked the members for being present and the meeting was adjourned at 1:30 p.m.
