

MECHANISM OF MARKING

1. As per the syllabus, 10 marks are to be allotted to each student per theory paper in a semester by the process of internal assessment.


3. Marks shall be allotted to all the students for Attendance, Online conduct, Class-test and Assignment on the basis of their presence and performance.

Practicals:


- 1) One Practical examination of 50(External 40+ Internal 10) marks and Examination duration will be three hours for all six semesters


