





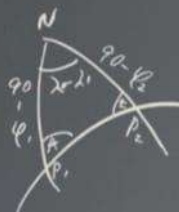

## Webinar series 'Masters' Paradigm' organised

THE webinar series organised jointly by Departments of Botany and Biochemistry and the Internal Quality Assessment Cell, Hislop College provided an exposure on relevant scientific developments of the recent times. The theme of the series was 'Masters' Paradigm: Season -2' for students. The 3-day programme brought to its ambit, 3 key aspects of concern ranging from cancer research to vaccine manufacturing to Wetland Conservation.

An expert talk on Molecular cures of Cancer was delivered by Dr Amitava Das, Principal Scientist, Indian Institute of Chemical Technology, Hyderabad.

The webinar provided new outlooks on the downstream regulation of certain molecular targets like Lipoprotein Lipases to control the recurrence of breast cancer. He also shared some new findings such as involvement of small molecules

and their potential role in cancer control. Dr Mashitha Pise conducted the programme and an interactive question and answer session. Over 270 participants across India attended this online event. Immortalising the first Indian lady to have secured the Ph.D. degree, Janaki Ammal memorial lecture was the banner for day 2 of Masters' Paradigm.

Dr Amit Godbole from SIIL, Pune spoke at length about the various aspects of vaccines beginning with the basics of types and classification, and then proceeding up to the stages of manufacturing and quality control. He spoke about the pros and cons of vaccination and took question from an eager audience, clearing apprehensions about the vaccine dosage, possible negative impacts etc.

Celebrating the culmination of the week of wetlands, and commemorating 50 years of the Ramsar Convention, student participation was invited for Power Point pre-

sentations on wetland conservation. Around 30 participants presented their views on an online platform which was judged by a panel of judges; Dr Anagha Patil, Dr Ashish Jha and Dr Pratik Michael.

Saleha Kapadia from Pillai College of Arts Commerce and Science, Navi Mumbai was adjudged the winner while Shrishti Devalia of Hislop College bagged the second prize. Yash Barokar and S Mubashra Ali were awarded consolation prizes.

The programme was highly appreciated by the students all over. Around 435 students actively participated over the 3-days of scientific discourse. The endeavor was conceptualised by the organising team comprising Dr Mousumi Bhowal, Dr Mashitha Pise, Parama Majumdar, Dr Rashmi Padhye, Sudipta Sarkar and Richa Dubey under the guidance of IQAC coordinator, Dr Pratik Michael and the leadership of Dr Pratik Michael. 

*Water conservation day is celebrated on 22nd of March. Water conservation includes all the policies, strategies and activities to sustainably manage the natural resource of fresh water, to protect the hydrosphere, and to meet the current and future human demand. Population, household size and growth and affluence all affect how much water is used. Factors such as climate change have increased pressures on natural water resources especially in manufacturing and agricultural irrigation.<sup>[1]</sup> Many countries have already implemented policies aimed at water conservation, with much success.<sup>[2]</sup>*

*The goals of conservation efforts include: Ensuring the availability of water for future generations where the withdrawal of freshwater from an ecosystem does not exceed its natural replacement rate.*

*Energy conservation as water pumping, delivery and wastewater treatment facilities consume a significant amount of energy. In some regions of the world over 15% of total electricity consumption is devoted to water management.*

*Habitat conservation where minimizing human water use helps to preserve freshwater habitats for local wildlife and migrating waterfowl, but also water quality.<sup>[3]</sup> The water that leaks from aquagaurd should be collected and could be used for household works.*

*The ways by which water can be conserved are -*

*Do not leave tap open.*

*Do not open the tap and run away.*

*Do not leave tap open while brushing; etc.*

### WATER SAVING TIPS

Turn off the water while washing your hair



Don't use running water to thaw food. Defrost food in the fridge.



Put tissues and cigarette butts in the bin - don't flush them



Don't fill your swimming pool and use a cover to prevent evaporation



Install water-saving shower heads and low-flow tap aerators



Don't use a hosepipe to wash your car. Use a bucket.



Use your dishwasher and washing machine only for full loads



Water your garden with a watering can rather than a hosepipe.



When washing dishes by hand, don't leave the water running for rinsing



Log water leaks in your neighbourhood with your local municipality



Collect cooled water used for cleaning and cooking vegetables to water pot plants



Use your water meter to check for hidden water leaks



Kettles should not be filled to the brim but with just enough water for your needs



Water conservation programs involved in social solutions are typically initiated at the local level, by either municipal water utilities or regional governments. Common strategies include public outreach campaigns, tiered water rates (charging progressively higher prices as water use increases), or restrictions on outdoor water use such as lawn watering and car washing. Cities in dry climates often require or encourage the installation of xeriscaping or natural landscaping in new homes to reduce outdoor water usage. Most urban outdoor water use in California is residential, illustrating a reason for outreach to households as well as businesses.

A Rally was taken by the students and teachers at the beginning of the event.



# Training Module for CRPF

## REPORT

A 6 day workshop on Floriculture, Vermicomposting, Mushroom cultivation and Basic tissue cultural practices was conducted by the department from March 20 – 25, 2017. The workshop included theory as well as hands-on and onsite training. The programme was conducted as a consultancy on the request of CRPF. The objective of the module was to train them about the basic concepts of the above practices through visual aids. To make the comprehension more lucid, an onsite demonstration was also provided by the faculty members.

### DAY: 1

The workshop initiated with an overview of the department and the various extension activities carried out by the faculty members. This session sensitized the CRFP Personnel regarding the importance of these activities as they are the foundation for conservation and protection of environment and in turn necessary for sustainable



development. This was followed by a guided tour of various laboratories and utility units available with the departments. Functioning of each of these units was explained in details. The session being highly interactive was able to bridge the knowledge gap as well as help them in understanding of the different environment related activities carried out by the Botany department.

### DAY: 2

The training session on day 1, covered the techniques for making vermicompost enriched with *Trichoderma*. A detailed account was given to the trainees regarding the methods of culturing *Trichoderma* and manner of treating the compost with it. Comprehensive protocols were also discussed. The routine of vermicompost production, which is otherwise an uncomplicated procedure, was discussed in context with several enrichment techniques.



### DAY: 3

Third day of the module included a hands-on training of mushroom cultivation. The curriculum was designed to address the basic requirements of a small scale/ cottage scale mushroom cultivation industry. The practical exposure given to the trainees encompassed sterilization techniques, bagging, inoculation etc. A detailed account of feasible, household methods of cultivation of



mushrooms, maintenance of the bags and harvesting upto 3 crops per bag was also given to them. The session culminated with discussions and explanations on individual queries and doubts.

### DAY: 4

The fourth day session started with a general introduction about commercial floriculture unit, its maintenance and plant propagation. The information about floricultural plants their classification according to the life span was explained. Plant propagation methods, maintenance and disease control for seasonals and annuals was discussed with audio visual aids.



Practical demonstration of propagation techniques was followed by individual hands on training, in seed bed preparation, seed germination techniques, transplantation of propagules, preparation of liquid manure. The session was ended with quenching the queries of the CRPF personnel related to plant propagation.

### DAY: 5

Floriculture training continued on fifth day session where propagation techniques, maintenance and disease control for perennial plants was taught followed by practical hands on training on budding and grafting methods. The trainees were given practical exposure to the routine of budding and maintenance of new plants. Along with this, the importance of soil preparation, types of soil and





plant-wise requirements were also discussed.

#### DAY: 6

Sixth day session started with the general introduction of the tissue culture, its basic techniques and its application. A detailed account was given to the trainees regarding the techniques of tissue culturing. Comprehensive protocols were also discussed right from selection and sterilization of explants to inoculation through PowerPoint



presentation and video. The trainees were also given technical knowhow of the instrument used for tissue culture purpose and the practical exposure given to the trainee encompassed sterilization and inoculation.

The interact club and rotaract club members even appreciated the people that were wearing helmets and seatbelts. They even explained the dangers of not following these rules.



After an hour of intense working in the heat and glaring sun, everyone was offered snacks and refreshments.

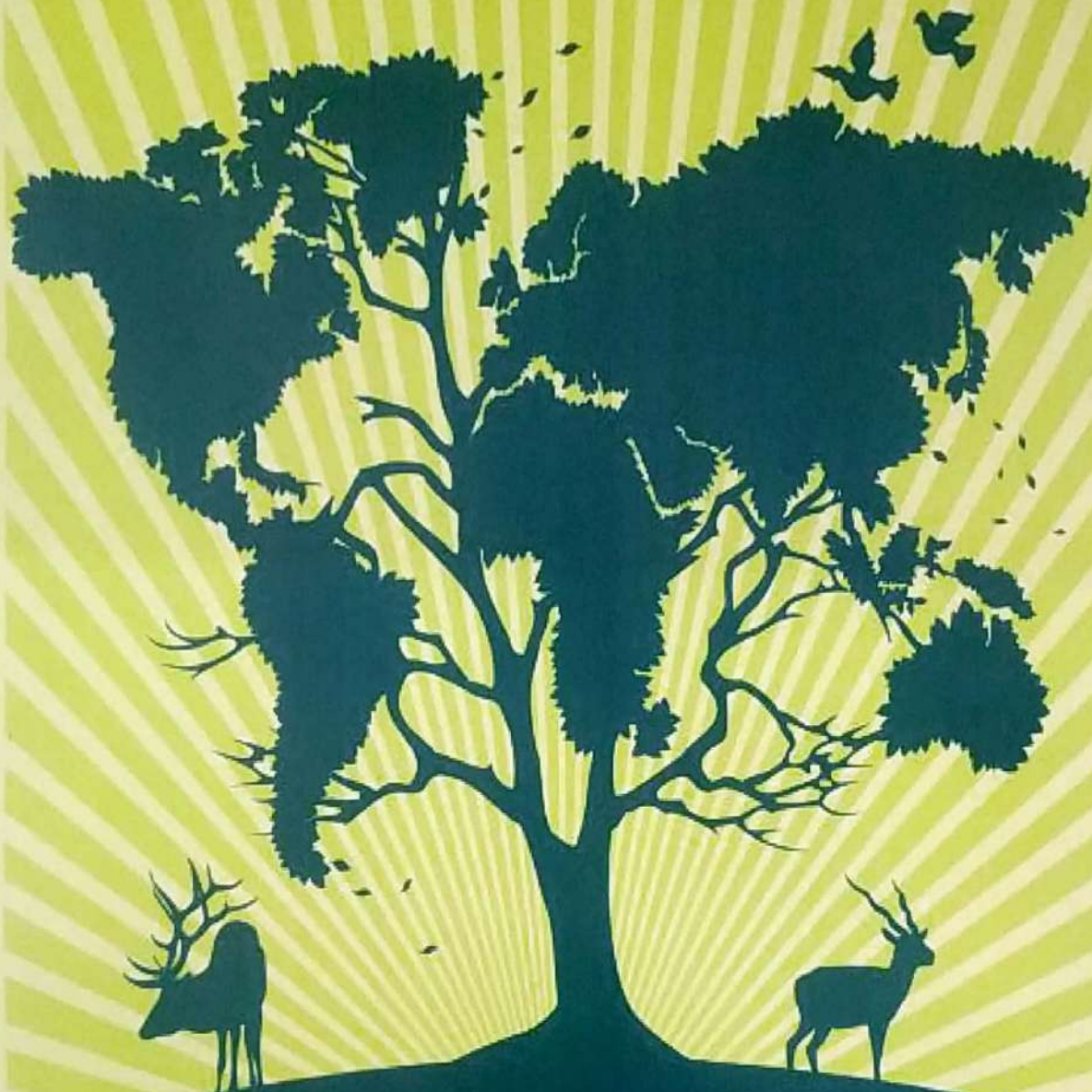








### Dental Checkup camp

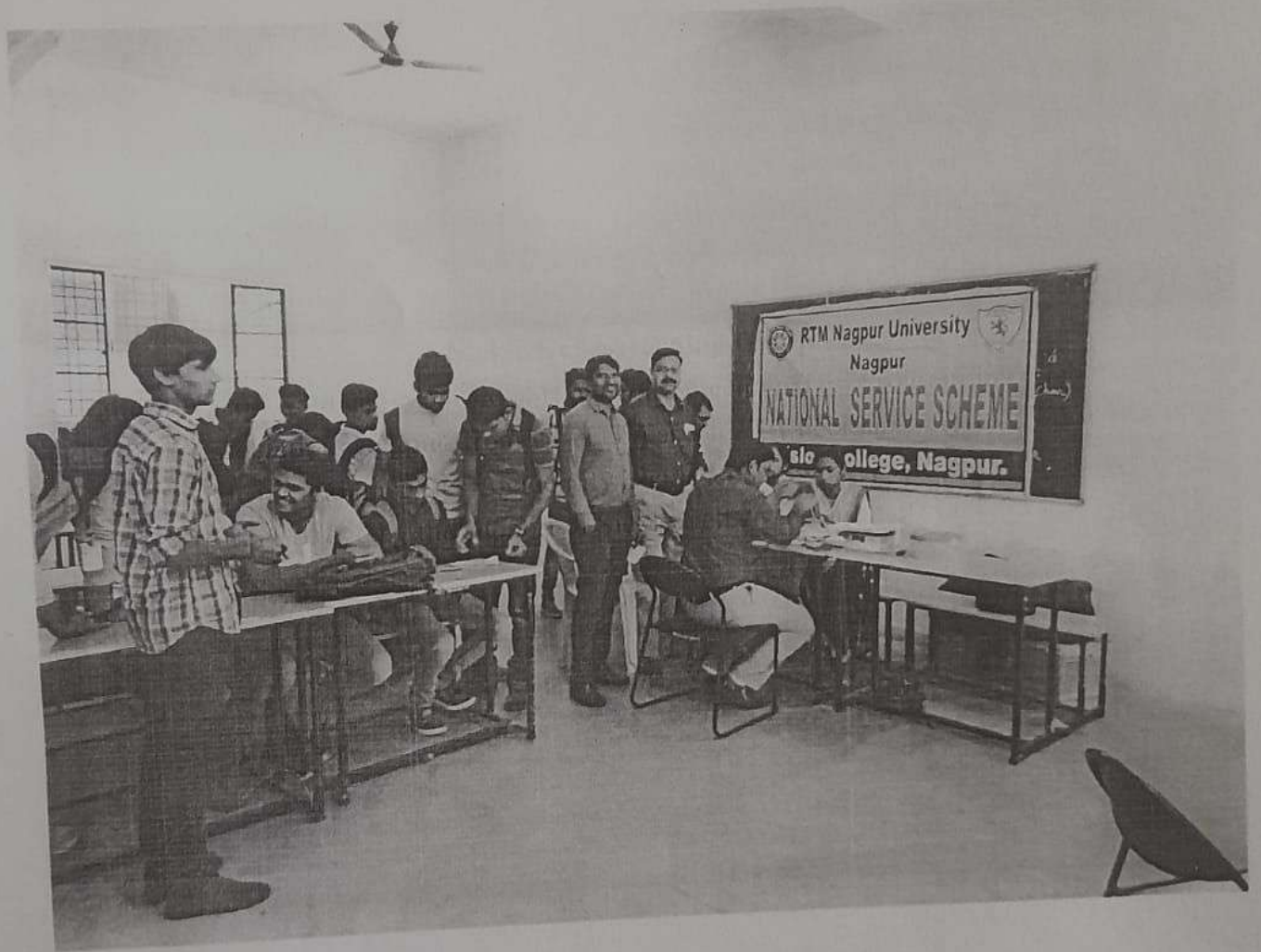
