REPORT: Foundation Course in Women's Studies

The foundation course was formally inaugurated by Dr. Sneha V. Deshpande, Director, Centre for Women's Studies, Rastrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur. She introduced the subject to the registered student members. It provided an insight on Women's Studies and Gender Intelligence. The session provided the participants an opportunity to gain an insight into facts for all situations whilst bringing in the reliability factor.

On the second day, Miss. Alefiya Vali, Department of English, Hislop College, Nagpur, introduced to Feminism. In this session an historical account of feminism, exploring its earliest roots as well as key issues including voting rights, the liberation of the sixties, and its relevance today. Also in our country feminism is a struggle for equality of women and an effort to make women become like men. The session ended with an interactive session.

Dr. Priya Ashvita Rajkumar, Department of Psychology, Hislop College, Nagpur conducted the session on 'Gender Sensitization' on the third day. It was an interactive session and through various activities the basic concepts like difference between sex and gender, gender roles, gender stereotypes, gender division of labour, gender discrimination, gender-based violence, masculinity, patriarchy, gender equality etc.

On the fourth day Dr. Raj Kumar, Director, Rainbow Christian Academy Pvt. Ltd., Nagpur and Dr. Namrata Babhulkar spoke on Legal awareness: Road to Empowerment. The lectures highlighted women's rights and was centered on legislation that ensure their safety and security. They stressed on Legal awareness as it was essential to safeguard rights of women. They explained the basics of criminal legal system including difference between cognizable and non-cognizable, bailable and non-bailable offences and civil and criminal cases etc. The also clearly explained in detail the processes like filing a police complaint and what goes into a FIR and a chargesheet.

Mr. Shubham Lakudkar a student of Hislop College and renowned national chess player shared his experiences on 'Ways to build Entrepreneurial skills' on the fifth day. The session ended with an activity on how to prepare phenyl at home and at low cost. This session was collaborated with Department of Chemistry. Dr. Monika Moses, Head, and Dr. Mayur Khedkar, Department of Chemistry explained and taught the participants on how to prepare phenyl.

The session for the sixth day was on 'Communication skills'. This was handled by Miss. Saleha Khan, Department of Psychology, Hislop College, Nagpur. This was an activity session. Through various activities the importance of Communication skills was highlighted.

On the final day, Dr. Shirin Bader, Department of English, Hislop College, Nagpur spoke on Film and Feminism. A short film was screened to learn about Feminism. There was a group discussion where all the participants actively participated.

She highlighted on how the law can be used at workplace when one is harassed sexually. Also, she stated and stressed how University Grants Commission is involved at College level on Anti Sexual Harassment like Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions.
