2. Feedback System has been formalized:

- Student online feedback system on teacher performance started on a pilot basis in 2015-16 has now been fully implemented.

- KRA and PBAS as instruments of teacher appraisal to be continued.

2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

1. Departmental TLE Innovations:

Teaching learning module have been developed by the departments as per their specific needs

- ICT:
 - Use of animations and videos to explain complicated processes .Use of NPTEL video lectures and use of CEC material prescribed by UGC.

- The departments have a good compilation of animations, videos and other ICT material which is regularly used to facilitate thorough understanding of the subject. Besides, the use of custom made ICT aids is a routine process.
- Online Web-based learning using an Internet browser to support traditional class room learning.

• Participatory Learning;

- It includes choosing a meaningful theme for projects combining inquiry with accountability. Performance assessments, is through write up, presentation viva voce.
- Concept based teaching which helps to overcome, rote learning of the curriculum. This is done using resources to teach ideas for deep and clear understanding,
- Reflection on the last topic before the start of new chapter stimulates recapitulation of the topic and streamlining further understanding.
- Assignments based on latest developments in the respective fields are allotted to the students and assessments are made on the basis of seminar presentation.
- Assignment of small experimental projects aligned to the practical curriculum to extend the scope of learning.
- Making students do small projects designed to make them learn auxiliary aspects of the topics and techniques to prove certain points
- 2. Bridge course conducted by all the departments to induce the first year students to the curriculum of graduation. The modules for Bridge Course are department specific and are conducted over a week's time.
- 3. Institution conducts **remedial classes & performance assessments** for slow learners and based on that it adopts methods of teaching to improve their level of learning.
- 4. Learn from Peer, is a mechanism for the slow learners who are guided by their peers.
- 5. **Mentoring activity is** routinely conducted by III and IV semester students for the juniors. It encourages peer learning.
- 6. Experts / Guest Speakers were invited to deliver talks on topics related to courses of study.
- 7. **Continuous Student Evaluation** through home assignments, seminars, presentations and tests are a regular feature.
- 8. Examination Boot Camp are conducted after completion of the syllabus to prepare the

students for university examinations based on question banks.

- 9. Academic clearance is continued as it helped in monitoring the classroom attendance of the students.

2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

IQAC is devoted to work on policies of quality upgradation and maintenance. Some of these are given below:

Calendar Streamlining

 IQAC works to streamline academic programmes of the College in order to efficiently manage the teaching hours. One of the steps taken is to ensure unified inauguration of programmes and organization of the same in the second half of the college hours.

Assessment & Refinement of Human Resource

- Internal workshops for newly appointed teachers, to induce them into the system and make them aware of the institutional roles and policies, are a regular practice.
- Teachers are required to fill a 'Key Result Area' (KRA) proforma at the beginning of each academic session. The proforma is designed to augment annual goals related to teaching, research and professional enrichment.
- IQAC evaluates and analyses the **PBAS** submitted by the staff acts as a diagnostic tool for determining their performance. The scores are assigned on the basis of UGC guidelines are then re-evaluated by the principal.
- IQAC has also worked closely with the HRD cell of the college, conducting various workshops to orient the in-house staff.



3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility:

ISR Activities:

1. Community Developmental activities:

- Developmental activities were organized in the "Pandharbodi" slum area of west Nagpur, through Hislop Institution for Social Action and Research (HISAR) and NSS.
- An awareness program on "Drug addiction" was conducted in association with Prayer Fellowship Organization of Kerala, on 16th December,2017.
- NSS unit organized Swachhta Pakhwara campaign from 1st to 15th September, 2017.
 NSS members and student volunteers participated in various community service programs and cleanliness drives.
- This year HISAR and NSS volunteers took environmental awareness as the key issue to be addressed. Programs on environmental awareness were organized in the month of December 2017.
- Sickle Cell Disease is very prevalent in Vidharbha region and NSS along with Sickle Cell Association, Nagpur conducted a screening program from 5th to 7th February, 2018 followed by a medical camp for dental and eye check up. A total of 465 people were screened during this camp.

2. Contribution to Environment and Biodiversity:

- NSS unit of the college, started the session with a tree plantation event on 3rd July, 2017. Second such effort was made by NSS along with Botany department on 15th July, 2017 in the college campus.
- Hislop Environment Cell, NGO "Khoj" and Forest Development Corporation of Maharashtra, jointly organized a plantation program in the tribal villages Paivibhor,

Nayakheda and Upankheda in Paratwara region of Amravati District on 16th July, 2017.

- Tree plantation drive by the Environment Cell, NSS & Rotaract Club of Hislop College to create mass awareness and participation of the students from 6th July to 16th July, 2017.
- Every year in the month of September, Ganesh Utsav is celebrated in the region for 10 days. Towards the end of the festival, a massive accumulation of solid wastes due to immersion of idols and nirmalaya in large quantities is witnessed in the major water bodies of the region. Environment cell of Hislop College in collaboration with the Rotary club, NSS and Nagpur Municipal Corporation, organized a Nirmalaya collection drive to prevent the possible lake pollution at Futala Lake.
- Wild Life Week was celebrated during first week of October, 2017. Programs like Butterfly count, Odonate counts were conducted on 3rd and 4th October respectively. In all 30 butterflies and 21 dragon flies were identified by the students
- Botanical Tours to Bordharan and Pench Wildlife sanctuaries, Biodiversity Park, Agro Parks and Wetland monitoring program at Vena Dam were also conducted during the session.

3. Care to specially abled people:

- D. A mega blood donation camp- Mahadan 3.0, was organized by Rotaract clubs of 25 countries on 16th March 2018. The college unit of Rotaract cell was a part of this activity.



5.6 Details of student counseling and career guidance

Student Counseling:

Academic Counselling and Guidance Cell guided students during admission time on programmes, electives and career options. At the departmental level, teachers provide help students to take well-informed decisions in course selection.

Student Mentoring Cell appointed senior students from second-year as 'Student Mentors' to guide juniors in their studies, career and campus life. The entire process is supervised by a Teacher-in-Charge. 

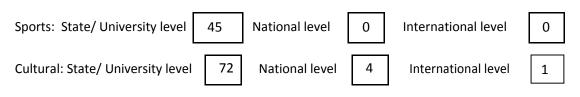


5.9.2 No. of medals /awards won by students in Sports, Games and other events

Beside curriculum prescribed by RTM Nagpur University. Beside curriculum prescribed by RTM Nagpur University. Beside curriculum academic year and total **9** value added/ career oriented courses were conducted by various departments of the college during **2017-2018** academic year.

1. **Teaching plans** for the course module for every session are prepared.

2. The Principal at regular intervals assesses the implementation of the teacher's teaching plan/module and the conduction of classes as per the time-table through staff diary.

3. Academic clearance has become a regular process in the clearance form of the students to monitor the classroom attendance of the students.

4. The teachers updated the Question banks as per the change in curriculum and distributed among the students.

5. Home assignments are regularly given to students for continuous assessment.

6. Unit tests and Terminal examinations are conducted as per the academic calendar.

7. Remedial courses are conducted by Departments for weak students.

8. Teachers took special efforts to identify weak students / slow learners in their class and if necessary,

involve fast-learners in their class to teach these students through 'Learn from Peer' activity.

9. Extra classes were conducted by teachers to complete the course prescribed in the syllabus, if necessary.

10. Digital feedback of students on teachers was introduced to bring more transparency in teaching and learning process

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- 1. Regular conduct of unit tests.
- 2. Ideal answers of the questions in unit tests are discussed with the students through Examination Boot Camp.
- 3. Continuous Evaluation of students through oral class test, home assignments, seminars, and projects.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- 1. A Course on 'Culture and Heritage Studies' is conducted in the History and Sociology department. This will help researchers of History, Archaeology and Allieed subjects to take up new projects.
- 2. The Institution upgraded and built infrastructural facilities through the UGC grants and funding from the management. Instruments, chemicals, hardware were added to the departments as per their requirements from their annual budget.
- 3. Funds from research project grants / consultancy services are also utilized to create infrastructural facilities for new areas of research.
- 4. Research Committee and IQAC take initiative in preparing and sending various proposals to UGC, ICSSR, DST, etc.
- 5. The total number of Research Centres in the College is 9. There are 40 faculty members who are recognized supervisors for Doctoral Research by the University.
- 6. **28** students have been **awarded Ph. D. degree** under the guidance of the supervisors while **40** students working in research centres and **21 have submitted their Doctoral research** in the session 2017-18

7. The percentage of staff with Ph. D. is 75 % (45 staff members out of 61 permanent faculties)

8. Staff member (from Commerce & Chemistry) have submitted their Ph. D. thesis to Nagpur University in this session.

9. The college publishes the research articles in the Bi-Annual Research Journal "HISLOPIA".

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library:

The College has UGC Network Resources Center and is a member of UGC-N list INFLIBNET. Faculties have access to more than 6000 e-journals and several links to e-learning resources. The Central Library and Department Libraries subscribe to over 20 National and 1 International journals. Total number of books in the central library 81193.

• Additionally, the College has an E-Learning Resource Center that provides 30,35,000 ebooks for faculty reference.

• NPTEL URLs are provided by the Library to the staff to utilize audio video resources for teaching of their subjects.

• Library also provides the Mobile application M-OPAC to staff and student users for book search from one or more library database as per the sorting key.

• Learning resource centre conducted the orientation programme for PG students of Psychology on 27th Feb 2018.

• Learning resource centre held a book exhibition on books written by and books on RTM Nagpur University on 4th October 2017. Guest lecture was conducted on 'Six Laws of Library Science' for the library staff on 11th November 2017.

• Library staff constantly participates and gets involved in Library related research work for up gradation of knowledge.

The library continued the following best practices:

• Library keeps track of regular user and acknowledges the student as the best reader in the College and prizes were awarded to 'Best Library User' and 'Best Book Reviewer' among the students.

• The best book reviews were published in the College Magazine-'The Hislopian'.

• UGC Book bank facility is availed to the students wherein the students can issue more than one book from the month of December till the exam clearance time.

• A popular Book deposit scheme is practised by the library during examination period to help the needy students to use books by depositing a nominal amount which is refundable after the books are returned.

ICT

• All Departments have computers with hi-speed internet connectivity. Moreover, teachers also use equipment purchased (laptops, printers, data card) with grants from major and minor research projects.

• Each Department has developed its own e-learning resources including lecture notes, handouts, question bank, teaching plans and topic-wise PPTs.

• Usage of power point presentation by the faculty is a regular feature.

• All departments have their own printers. Several also have multi-functional printers with photocopier and scanner.

• Sharing of files and data in the college is effected by LAN.

• ICT-enabled Classrooms with LCDs, interactive board enable teachers to use a combination of ICT-tools and traditional pedagogy methods.

• Teachers make use of e- learning resources, OERs, mobile apps, webinars, LCDs, OHPs, PPTs, educational and entertainments films, MOOCs, and other virtual resources.

Physical infrastructure /Instrumentation

- Instruments are added to the departments as per their requirements through UGC Grants.
- New equipments were added by the staff from their Research project grants and Consultancy services.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

110 staff members were benefited from various programmes organized by Human Resource Development cell of the college during 2017-18 academic year.

6.3.7 Faculty and staff recruitment

- The College appoints its faculty and staff purely on merit basis. Candidates have to give a teaching demonstration based a topic in the subject followed by an interview.
- Qualified Adhoc / CHB/ Guest faculty is appointed against the vacant post as per the departmental requirement.
- Daily-wages staff is recruited as per the need of the office and the Departments.
- Mechanism to review and monitor progress of recruited staff periodically:
- Assessment of annual progress and achievements of the teaching faculty is done by the Principal at the end of the academic session.
- Regular practice of Feed- back from students on newly recruited teaching staff.
- Based on the assessment of student feed-back, the temporary faculty is recalled for interview. Efforts are made for professional development of faculty / staff by sending them for refresher courses, faculty improvement programme, soft skill training programmes etc.

To commemorate this milestone in the history Professor Ashish Nandy the renowned social scientist and an illustrious alumnus, delivered the Hislop Memorial Lecture he was also the chief guest of this programme.

3. EXAMINATION: STRESS MANAGEMENT

Hislop College Alumni Association conducted a self help programme on October 10, 2017 for students selected under the HOPE Sponsorship Programme. This programme was conducted to emotionally strengthen the students and help them tackle the pressure and stress faced during the examination time

4. TRAINING MODULE: LIFE SKILL BASED WORKSHOPS

In the session 2017-18 Rotary Club of Nagpur conducted the Life Skill workshop for Hislop Students. The 6 hour module was conducted over two days on 6 and 7 March 2018.

5. HOPE-FINANCIAL SPONSORSHIP FOR HISLOP STUDENTS

Hislop College Alumni Association organized the VI edition of "HOPE - The Financial Sponsorship Scheme" on March 8, 2018. A Motivational talk was conducted for the 80 students selected under this scheme. A total of 80 students were sponsored by HISCAAN of which three girl students' one each from Commerce, Arts & Science streams were sponsored by Mr. Umesh Shrikhande former president Parents Teachers Association of Hislop College.

6.12 Activities and support from the Parent – Teacher Association

Annual General Body Meeting of Parent-Teacher Association was conducted on 23rd September 2017. In the annual meeting the office bearers were installed. Feedbacks and suggestions were noted.

The parents put forward the following issues and solutions to these issues are discussed.

- 1. Students have to wait in the long queues at the time of paying examination fees and filling examination forms due to which sometimes they have to miss a class. So, a time schedule is to be prepared and followed as per the time table for paying fees at the counter.
- 2. More staff should be appointed towards cleanliness of the washrooms. Students who are not regular in attending regular classes and unit tests should not be qualified for academic clearance.
- 3. The executive members of PTA should meet more frequently.

- 4. Principal responded to their complaints and suggestions. She said that additional daily wages staff is recruited for cleaning the wash rooms and the norms for academic clearance are already decided and implemented since three years back.
- 5. Parents ensured the attendance of the students in the college.

6.13 Development programmes for support staff

Three Programmes of a week and fortnight duration on Computer Literacy were conducted for staff and students by the Computer Science Department.IIT tutorial was conducted by Computer Science Department and 3 faculty members passed IIT Mumbai C tutorial test.

6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly

- 1. Process of energy audit has been started by the expertise of Pune University. The main aim and objective is to save electricity and make college campus utilise maximum renewable energy source.
- 2. Another unique feature of Hislop green initiative is that guests visiting the College are welcomed with saplings grown in-house. This encourages the habit of growing plants among people, besides substantially cutting down the use of cellophane and other artificial material.
- 3. Waste matter from mushroom cultivation and bio-degradable waste from canteen and hostel kitchen are turned into compost by the Vermicomposting unit. 'Save Paper, Save Trees' is the motto the College follows in its attempts to make a transition from paper-based to paper-less intra-office communication. Displays for college and departmental programmes are made electronically, thus reducing the use of flex, banner and poster material as well as costs.
- Use of biodegradable paper cups is encouraged in the college premises thus taking the college a step closer towards being 'Plastic Free' zone. Sale of 'Holi' colours, free of harmful chemical dyes, was organized in the College for students, staff and the general public.

- Hislop College was recognised as a Lead College for the use of Online Tutorials.
- Computer Literacy, English Communication Skills, Sanskrit Spoken Classes were conducted.
- Workshop on Robotics was conducted to impart the skills sets to the students.

3. Use of ICT in Teaching Learning: Departments make use of Videos for teaching concepts to students. Teachers have also recorded lectures and made educational videos which are shared with the students for after class learning support and for students who are slow learners.

Impact:

- Better performance in the Class/Unit tests and University Exams with 26 merit holders.
- 24*7 availability of the lectures.

• Helped in boosting the morale of slow learners who felt shy in asking the doubts in class room.

4. *Promotion of Entrepreneurship Skills:* With a view to instil the passion and spirit among students to pursue entrepreneurship, the ED Cell of Hislop College motivated students to think of creative business ideas towards developing a small start-up.



The programme was conducted by resource persons Mr.AnkitGongole and Mr.Abhilash Khobragade both cohort members of Lemon School of Entrepreneurship. Various factors were highlighted by the resource persons for establishment of a successful enterprise.
- An interactive guest lecture by Dr. Kapil Chandrayan, expert member, Vidarbha Development Board was organized on 11th September, 2017 focusing on the Public Private Partnership Model.
- A guest Lecture titled 'R U Game for Entrepreneurship?' by Mr. Mangesh Joshi was organized on 16th February, 2018. He focused on the Requisite qualities of an Entrepreneur and experiences as an entrepreneur.
- An exposure to students through a 3 day Entrepreneurship Summit at IIT-Kharagpur was arranged.

EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS

- Students Conceptualised, Designed and produced handmade products like multipurpose folder, pens, notepads, envelopes, paper bags, etc.
- 400 Christmas cards were made by a group of students as a part of 'Earn while you Learn' project.
- A Business Model by the students on 'Sanitary Waste Disposal' bagged a Second Prize worth Rs. 3000/- and a Scholarship worth Rs. 30,000/- in a Business Masterminds Competition.
- Students attended the 3 day Entrepreneurship Summit at IIT-Kharagpur for exposure to various entrepreneurial opportunities.

The College took an initiative to get approval of a study centre for running courses of Indira Gandhi National Open University. Approval was granted for offering a total of 10 programmes out of which 8 programmes started from the session 2017-18. Other than this college also focused on optimum use of Open Access Learning Platforms and Skill development Programmes. Teachers shared Video Lectures with students for better comprehension.
