### **Workshop on: Traffic Rules and Safety**

Traffic Rules and Safety workshop was conducted on 25<sup>th</sup> September 2018 by the Human Right and Equal Opportunity Cell along with NSS for which plenipotentiary traffic constables were invited to address the students. Chief guest of the event was A.G Wazir Shiekh, accompanied by Head Constable Atul Aagarkar, Head Constable Nilesh Thakre, and Head Constable Rajendra Gehrkar, who guided the students on the significance of following traffic rules as it involves the most important right -Right to Life. Head Constable Atul Aagarkar presented a PPY about traffic rules and explained about the importance of 'license'. He explained the 4 E's of Maintaining Traffic: *Education, Enforcement, Engineering, Environment and Emergency Care* deciphering about traffic signals, surface marking, overtaking rules, lane rules and gave tips for traffic safety. Head Constable Atul Aagarkar made the event insightful by playing a video showing the difference between how the Indian and German citizens follow traffic rules and regulations, highlighting the callous and negligent attitude of our countrymen. Head Constable made the students and staff take a pledge, that 'they will follow all the traffic rules and regulations and values given in our constitution and will drive safely'.
